Woven with passion and creativity, unique furniture store Schema brings to the country its world-class furniture and home accessories. Formerly known as Kalikasan Crafts, Schema specializes in creating handwoven metal wire products with premium quality that can add a sense of modernity and lightness (pun intended) to any living space.

Products of Schema are produced not by a machine but are carefully and intricately woven by the hands of their talented artisans. They use mainly galvanized iron wires or sheets in creating delicate, complex wire designs and patterns that maximize functionality and character of every piece.

Schema's main designer is founder Celia Gamboa-Jiao, but the brand also collaborates with different designers around the globe such as French designer Segolene Aebi-Faye, Thai industrial designer Anon Pairot, and local interior designer Budji Layug.

"From afar, our products look like fabric because of the really thin spaces between the wires. That's why it's very unique to use in condos because it functions like fabric that can lighten up a space yet not obstruct any design," shares Jerry Jiao of Schema.

Aside from its product collection, Schema also offers lighting design consultancy and installation. From traditional Filipino to modern-contemporary, Schema has different pieces suitable for all kinds of design that will make any condo unit look bright and light. ©
